VIKING SPIRIT AWARD

500,000 EDMODO USERS

SCHOOL ZONE SPEED LIMITS

This school year there were new flashing/warning lights installed on North Wall St. The speed laws in a school zone have not changed. The lights were put in place to give an additional visual indicator/reminder that you are driving in a school zone and that while the lights are flashing, children may be present walking to and from school.

Again, the laws have not changed. If you are driving in a school zone on a normal school day (Monday thru Friday, typically September into June), during the hours that children would be walking to or from school (generally one hour before or after school hours, which are 8:00 a.m. – 3:15 p.m. here in Denmark), if children are present, the speed limit is 15 MPH. If no children are present, the speed limit is 25 MPH. The 15 MPH speed limit is also in place during lunch with our open campus for high school students.

The flashing amber lights are on from approximately 7:00-8:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m, and from 3:00-4:00 p.m. to give an additional visual reminder that students may be walking to or from school during those times and, if they are, the speed limit is 15 MPH.

The "children present" guidelines do not come into use if a gym class or sports team is using the practice field north of the high school or the ECC students are in their play area.

A simple rule of thumbs is....if you are driving near a school during a normal school day and kids are walking near the school, the speed limit is 15 MPH.

SCHOOL FINANCE NEWS FROM TONY KLAUBAUF, DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR

On October 25, 2010, the Denmark School Board set the tax levy at \$5,746,398 for the 2010-11 budget year providing a school district mill rate of 9.69264 or \$9.69 for each \$1000 of property value. The tax levy increased 1.8% and the mil rate just over 3% compared to the 2009-10 school year. With property values decreasing across the district by 1.42% (decreasing for the first time ever), the amount each taxpayer pays for school taxes will vary depending upon the equalized value of property within individual municipalities.

State equalization aid for the 2010-11 school year is \$9,607,604 — a decrease of \$300,000 from the 2009-10 school year. This decrease in State financial support places the burden on school boards to either cut school services or raise taxes. The Denmark School Board was able to limit the tax increase for a number of reasons:

The district refinanced long-term debt to adjust payments for the next seven years. While the district will pay more interest during this time, the mil rate increase was held to 3% instead of the proposed 8% for 2010-11. In addition, the debt portion of the levy/mil rate will be reduced for the following two budget years.

The district continues to trim personnel as employees leave the district or retire. The administration alone has been cut 25% over the past five years.

Federal dollars provided relief to state and local taxpayers. Without these dollars the program cuts would be deeper or the taxes would be significantly higher.

The voters of Denmark granted authority to the district to override the revenue limit by \$700,000 in 2009-10, \$800,000 in 2010-11, and \$900,000 for 2011-12. However, because of the economy and because federal dollars were available to offset local costs, the School Board only used \$150,000 for the 2009-10 year and \$300,000 for the 2010-11 school year.

Without having a State Budget debated and approved for the 2011-12 school year, predicting the district's financial shape for next year is difficult. However, the district has \$256,000 in federal educational funds available and one last year of authority to exceed the revenue limit. Hopefully we will be able to maintain programs for the 2011-12 school year.

On the other hand, State level support for schools is predicted to be reduced for the foreseeable future. The Denmark District, along with many other districts, is in a conundrum. Are local voters able and willing to exceed the revenue cap to help districts maintain programs? Are deep cuts into district programs and services necessary to maintain fiscal viability? Stay involved as the district reaches out to the community for answers over the next year. The district will most likely need to ask for support to exceed the revenue limits for the 2012-13 school year and beyond.

FAMILY ASSISTANCE DURING ECONOMIC DOWNTURN

- Free and Reduced meal applications are accepted anytime during the school year!
- Economic changes within the household may qualify students for Free or Reduced meals. Please Apply!
- Once a household qualifies for Free or Reduced meals the student is qualified for the entire school year, even if your economic situation changes.
- Approved Free and Reduced meal applications last for only one school year, so you need to apply every school year.

EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENING

The School District of Denmark will be offering **Early Childhood Screening** for children who will be 3 - 4½ years of age by September 1, 2011. The school district will use census data to mail out developmental surveys to parents of these children, asking parents to complete the questionnaire and return it promptly by mail. School professionals will score the questionnaire and provide written feedback to parents on the general developmental readiness levels of their child. In certain circumstances, the school district will invite children to participate in additional on-site screening to better assess school developmental readiness levels. Children identified with developmental delays from this additional screening could be eligible for free school district services (i.e.; speech and language therapy or early childhood special education programming), or parents may be encouraged to enroll their child in the school district's four-year-old Kindergarten program to assist in strengthening any area(s) of developmental delay. These parents will also be provided suggestions for home activities to assist their children.

If you have a child who will turn 3 - 4½ years old by September 1, 2011, please watch for this developmental questionnaire in the mail. You should receive it between January 19 and January 25, 2011. We ask you to complete it and return it promptly by mail.
