

#### WILL YOUR CHILD BE TURNING FOUR YEARS OLD BY SEPTEMBER 1, 2016?

It is with great pleasure that we invite your child to attend our four-year-old kindergarten program for the 2016-17 school year. If your child will be four years old on or before September 1, 2016, they are eligible to participate in our 4K program, focused on developing "the whole child."

A parent orientation meeting for those families who have registered their child(ren) will be held on **Tuesday**, **August 16**, **2016**, in the **Denmark High School cafetorium from 6:00-7:00 PM**. Administration and 4K teachers will share specific information about the school district and 4K program, including a curriculum overview, our parent outreach program, child care options, and transportation information. Any questions you may have about our 4K program will be addressed at that time.

Students and parents will again have an opportunity for wraparound childcare for half-day 4K students this coming school year. Information about this program will be available at the meeting or you may stop in the ECC office or contact Shawn Short, coordinator, at 920-863-4197.

The Denmark Early Childhood Center's 4K program is offered four half-days a week with one day dedicated as an outreach and planning day. For 2016-17, this outreach day of no school will again be on FRIDAYS. The morning session will run from 7:55-11:00 AM and the afternoon session from 12:00-3:05 PM. Session assignments will be determined over summer and parents will be notified of placement in August. Thank you for your interest in our programs, and we look forward to having you and your child(ren) join the Early Childhood Center family.

#### JUMP ROPE FOR HEART

This February, all first through fifth grade classes at the Elementary School participated in Jump Rope for Heart during their physical education time. The students rotated through many active stations to increase their heart rates, learn how their hearts work, and how to care for them through physical activity and good nutrition.

The students could also collect donations for the American Heart Association and receive "Thank You" gifts in return. These funds go to help support cardiovascular research and educational programs about heart disease, stroke, and the importance of exercise for maintaining good health.

This year Denmark Elementary reached a new high in Donations — \$21,838!!! This amount allowed us to receive \$1,200 in gift certificates for physical education equipment. Also, because we were one of the top five schools in the Northeast Wisconsin area, we qualified to participate in the "Sausage Races" at the Green Bay Gamblers game on March 19. Third grade teacher, David Lutze, represented our school in the race as the "Hotdog." Being the tough competitor that he is, he beat out the other sausages and earned our school another \$300 in gift certificates.

Second grader, Alexander Rozum, was the top earner for our school. Alexander brought in \$360 in donations for the American Heart Association. A big thank you goes out to him and to all of the students who participated in Jump Rope for Heart this year, the families that collected donation for the AHA, and to the parents that came in and helped out during their child's physical education class.

#### SCIENCE OLYMPIAD TEAM

Denmark's Science Olympiad team traveled to UW-Stout for the Wisconsin State Science Olympiad competition on Saturday, April 2. This was the third year in a row that the team has qualified for that state competition. The team took medals in five events with the top 50 teams in the State of Wisconsin competing. It was a great run with a team finish of 7th overall.

Science Olympiad does not have divisions; thus, small schools like Denmark compete against very large schools from metropolitan areas making competitions extremely challenging and competitive. For a team having been in existence only three years it was a great showing for the team to finish 7th overall. Science Olympiad is a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) based competition covering a wide variety of topics providing widespread appeal to a large diversity of students. Science Olympiad's goals are to create a passion for learning science by supporting Science Olympiad tournaments at local, district, state and national levels with an emphasis on teamwork and a commitment to excellence.
