2019-2020 Tax Levy

The Denmark School Board approved the tax levy of \$7,307,317 for the 2019-20 school year. The mill rate for the School District is \$8.88 per \$1,000 of property value. This is a slight increase from the 2018-19 mill rate of \$8.64 per \$1,000 of property value. For \$100,000 of property value, this is an increase of approximately \$24.00 per year.

Please keep in mind, each municipality within the School District of Denmark can be and will be different than this general mill rate. Your school property tax decrease or increase will depend on if your property was improved, you were re-assessed or if there was growth within your municipality. There was an approximate increase of 4% in the equalized property value in the District as a whole.

For a very simplified example how increased assessed value can impact taxes, see the example below:

Happy Town Municipality has only two property owners. The municipality must have \$1,000 to cover the District portion of the tax bill. Each property is valued the same in this example and is taxed by the District at \$500 each. During the next year, a third house is built. The School District needs an additional \$200 to meet their needs as a referendum question was approved, and therefore, the Happy Town Municipality has to pay \$1,200 in District taxes instead of \$1,000. However, because each homeowner in this example has the same assessed property value, each homeowner owes \$400 to cover the \$1,200 owed. Each former property owner actually owes \$100 less in school property tax to cover the increased cost.

Denmark has historically been below the mill rate compared to most school districts, and is considered a low revenue district. Last year the average school district mill rate was \$9.34 per \$1,000 of property value. Currently we pay approximately \$46 less per \$100,000 of property value than the average school district in Wisconsin.

School District of Denmark Facility Study - Phase 1

In August, the Board of Education had a public presentation on Phase I of the facility study and educational needs assessment that Miron Construction and Bray Architects conducted for the District. Over the past few months the District has reviewed this study and prioritized our maintenance needs District-wide. We are nearing the conclusion of Phase 1 of the facility study and by January 2020, the District will have developed a short term (3 year) plan to maintain our current facilities that meet the mission of our District, which is to provide the highest level of educational programming to ensure student success within school and beyond.

Beginning in spring, the District will begin working on long term facility plans, options and solutions that meet the needs of our educational programming.

Operational Referendum

In 2008, 2014 and 2017 our community supported 3 year operational referendums that allowed the District to maintain programs, address building maintenance, enhance security and upgrade technology.

This school year, the funding from the 2017 referendum will end. At this time the District is developing a scope for a future operational referendum that would be put to a public vote April of 2020.

2019 Great Apple Crunch

The School District of Denmark once again participated in the Great Lakes Apple Crunch on October 10th. This event is to bring awareness to purchasing local produce and celebrate farm to school month by crunching into a locally grown apple all at the same time! Our apples that we crunched were locally purchased from Stedl Orchards. Thank you to Mr. Stedl for supplying us with fresh apples every fall!







Denmark FFA Competes at Nationals

The State Parliamentary Procedure Champions, Denmark FFA, competed in the National Parliamentary Procedure Leadership Development event in Indianapolis from October 30th - November 1st. This contest is considered the Super Bowl of all leadership development events due to the intense competition and the amount of time required for competition. Members demonstrated their knowledge through three written exams, two team problem solving activities and two meeting demonstrations where the team successfully finished overall in 6th place out of 42 teams. The team earned 1st place in the secretaries minutes exam where they had the highest combined team score on this exam. Team members include Katrina Hoesly, Joe Schlies, Emily Nelsen, Autumn Kaminski, Abbey Wanek, and Owen Petrich.

Formula Student USA

The Engineering Principles class at the high school has always been problem-based where students are given a problem with a set of constraints that they need to solve. Past problems have included catapults, Rube Goldberg devices, and bridge design. This year, the students in Engineering Principles have been challenged with their biggest problem yet; build a race car! The car will be designed, built, and tested while following guidelines set forth by a program called Formula Student USA.

Dozens of schools from all over Wisconsin are involved with the Formula Student USA program. Some programs, like Denmark, are new to the competition, while others have been participating for over a decade. However, the experience at Denmark is unique from most schools because the program is part of a class where other schools run it as an extracurricular activity. In addition to designing and building the car, the students are also tasked with program promotion, fundraising and ordering parts. There is also a strong focus on soft skills such as communication, respect, time management and initiative work ethic.

The program culminates with a pair of race days (May 11th and 12th) at Road America in Elkhart Lake. Team Denmark will compete against dozens of other teams to see who can turn a lap the fastest! The competition will be great, but the experience of solving a complex problem is even more beneficial for these students.

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF DENMARK Annual Notices

Special Education Referral/Evaluation Process

Referral:

Any person, including parents, who reasonably believes that a child is a child with a disability may refer the child to a local educational agency, LEA. A person wishing to make a referral must make it in writing. The referral should explain why the person thinks the child has a disability. Contact the special education office for a referral form.

Getting Consent to Evaluate:

Within 15 business days of receiving a referral to evaluate a student, or initiating a re-evaluation, the Individual Education Plan (IEP) team must complete its review of existing evaluation data and send the parent/guardian a request for consent to evaluate, or if no additional data are necessary, notify the parents of that determination. "Business day" means Monday through Friday except for Federal and State holidays. Parents can refuse to give consent to evaluate, but if a school district feels strongly a child needs to be evaluated, they may go to due process to get permission to test. (For a re-evaluation, consent is not required.)

Determining Eligibility:

Within **60 calendar days** of receiving parent consent to evaluate, or informing parents that no additional assessment or evaluation data are needed, the LEA/School District must complete its evaluation of the student and determine whether the student is or continues to be a "child with a disability" under Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

The 60-day timeline may be extended for the following reasons:

- *When the student is being evaluated for a specific learning disability for the first time and the school needs more time to gather information about a student's response to interventions (Rtl).
- *When a student transfers from one district to another during the 60-day time period.
- *When the parent repeatedly refuses or fails to make the student available for an evaluation or a re-evaluation.

IEP and Placement:

Within 30 calendar days of determining a student is or continues to be a "child with a disability", the IEP team must meet to develop an IEP and determine a placement for the student. *If agreed upon by the parent, the IEP and placement meeting can take place at the same time of the eligibility meeting. However, if a parent needs time to review information, another meeting will be set up. At the IEP/Placement meeting, a parent/guardian can deny placement and services and a school cannot override this decision. Only one parent's consent is required.

- *Once per year, an annual IEP meeting is held to review IEP goals, services, and placement.
- *Every 3 years the IEP team will conduct a re-evaluation unless agreed upon by parents and IEP team that it is unnecessary. The same above timeline is used for re-evaluations.



Chartwells Food Service

Parents are able to access meal information and add funds online for your child's meals through Infinite Campus. There is a flat \$2 fee per transaction to make online payments. Denmark School District Preschool Screening Notice Children Age 3 (and turning 3 or 4)

In Accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and the Child Find Law, School District of Denmark follows a procedure to locate, refer and identify, as early as possible, young children who are in need of an Early Intervention Program or Early Childhood Services.

If you live in the School District of Denmark and have a child who is age 3 or turning age 3 or 4 during the upcoming school year, please notify the School District of Denmark's Early Childhood Office at 920-863-4177.



Once you have contacted the school, you will be placed on a list to receive a questionnaire to complete called the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ). The ASQ is sent in early January of the current school year and helps the district Child Find Team determine if further screening is needed for your child.

Ruby's is a local excess food distribution program, NOT an income-based food pantry. For a \$20 donation, each guest will receive 2 boxes filled with food. This donation helps to cover expenses related to warehousing and transporting the food items. Once per month, a semi-truck full of food is delivered to Our Savior's Lutheran Church (435 Wisconsin Ave., Denmark). Volunteers from around the community work to unload the truck, and to organize the various food items. Volunteers then distribute up to 400 shares during the event to



individuals who live in Denmark, Green Bay, Manitowoc, and the surrounding areas. Each guest should bring 2 totes for each share they receive. Some guests arrive much earlier than 4:30, and there is usually a line of 100 people when we open at 4:30. DON'T LET THAT STOP YOU FROM COMING! Our Ruby's distribution is designed to move quickly--but not too quickly. Our volunteers will greet you, and certainly want to meet you. We will help to get your totes filled and then load everything into your vehicle. It's as simple as that. No qualifications, just a \$20 donation, and bring 2 totes.
