Facility Study and Strategic Plan

This past April the Board of Education partnered with Miron Construction and Bray Architects to conduct facility and educational needs assessments for the District. Through this process we will be assessing and evaluating all aspects of our facilities and grounds inside and out. This includes, but is not limited to safety, HVAC, roofing, parking lots, traffic flow, all educational spaces and athletic facilities. We will then match those assessments and evaluations with the educational needs of our District.

Our goal is to develop a 5 and 10 year strategic plan to maintain and establish facilities that meet the mission of our District. Which is to provide the highest level of educational programming to ensure student success within school and beyond. The facility and education needs evaluation and assessment is scheduled to be completed by the end of August. We will be hosting an open review and presentation of the assessment for the community when complete.

Attention Families with Children Ages 0-3 Years

In Wisconsin, every county has a Birth to 3 Program which is an early intervention program for infants and toddlers with developmental delays and disabilities. The program can assess the child's developmental ability in the following areas:

- Learn and Play
- Move, See and Hear
- Communicate
- Develop Relationships
- Perform Basic Self-Care
- Express and Regulate Emotions



A child must have a developmental delay of at least 25% in one area as noted through Birth to 3 evaluation procedures or other records. If a child is found eligible, Birth to 3 provides services to the child in any area identified as delayed. The agency also assists in the transition to the school setting. If you have any concerns about our child's development in the areas listed above, you should inform your child's pediatrician or contact the Birth to 3 Agency in your county.

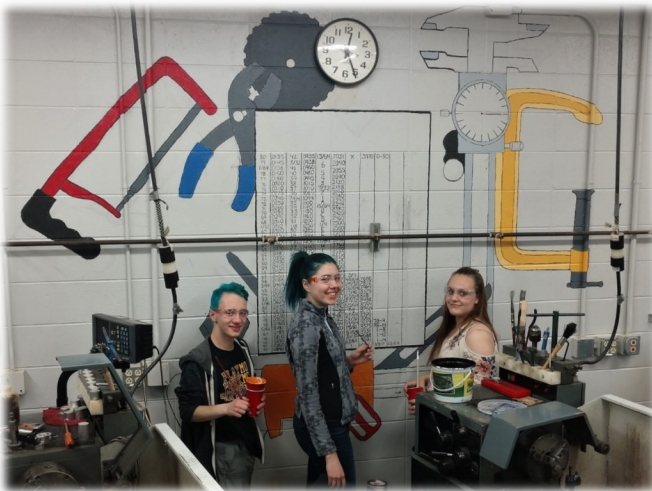

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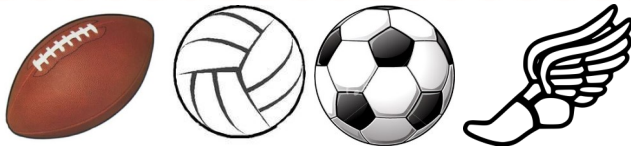

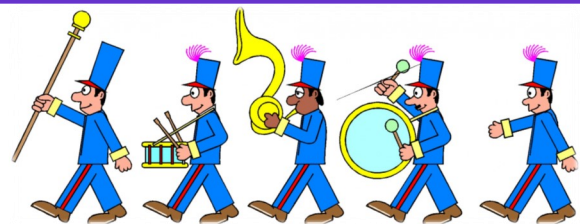
