Maintaining the Current Level of Operational Referendum Support

Our students are excelling and engaging in great courses, programs and co-curricular opportunities in the School District of Denmark! As indicated by the Department of Public Instruction state report card, the District is "Exceeding Expectations"! Our great families, excellent staff and community support lead to our students' success.

District Administrator In 2008, 2014 and again in 2017 our community supported a multi-year operational referendum that allowed the District to maintain educational programs, address building maintenance, enhance security, and upgrade technology. Due to this support, we have been able to maintain appropriate class sizes and provide our students with excellent opportunities in and outside of the classroom. The District has also been able to adequately maintain our facilities and add several safety features, including a secure entrance at the High School, a new roof on the Elementary School and an upcoming new roof on the Middle School.

This year, the funding from the 2017 operational referendum will sunset. In response to our community, the School Board adopted a resolution to place a referendum question on the April ballot to renew funding for 3 years at the amount of \$925,000 per year.

The requested amount of operational referendum funding is the same as in 2017. Without this funding, the District's overall budget would be decreased by approximately 5.7% next school year and beyond. Retaining the same amount of funding will allow us to maintain our current level of programs and continue our school services to our students. These funds will also enable us to remain responsive to meet our student's needs in the areas of safety, technology and facilities.

In 2017, 69% of voters supported the operational referendum on election day

2020 Referendum & 2020-21 School Budget Impact On My Taxes

If the operational referendum passes on April 7, 2020, the 2020-2021 projected mill rate for school district funding will be approximately \$9.04 per \$1,000 of property value. The average state mill rate for 2019-2020 is 9.37. The estimated cost increase for a home valued at \$100,000 is \$22 impact per year or \$1.83 per month.







How Do Students Qualify for Free/Reduced Meals?



Household size and income determine your status for free/reduced meal benefits. Eligibility for foster children is based on the children's income alone, not the household income where they reside.

Only one application is needed per household (available in every school office or online in the Infinite Campus Portal) and can be submitted to your school office or sent to Kristi Buhr, 450 N. Wall St., Denmark, WI 54208. Parents or guardians dissatisfied with the ruling can discuss the decision with Kristi Buhr at (920) 863-4217. A formal appeal can be requested by phone or in writing to Katie Rabenhorst, School Board President, 4792 R. Kane Lane, Denmark, WI 54208 (920) 819-9786.



OHP provides access to dental services and oral health education to children on medical assistance, or who are uninsured and without financial resources., Our goal - get kids established in a prevention, maintenance and education program with a cleaning every six months.

We Accept Children Who:

- Are 0-10 years of age
- Have ForwardHealth, Medicaid or a BadgerCare card
- Have no private dental insurance or dental home
- If uninsured, must be eligible for free and reduced lunch in school

OHP's traveling school-based program offers preventative and restorative services to children four days each week, right in their schools. Dental Services are brought directly to kids in need, eliminating the barriers of parent work schedules, transportation, and other factors that can prevent a child from getting needed care.
