### Being Diligent With Safety Guidelines and Staying in School

Since the beginning of the new year, our COVID-19 numbers have been low. We have been able to stay in-person at school since a scheduled virtual week after Thanksgiving. Our students have done a really good job at following guidelines, masking, and sanitizing. Due to their diligence, we have been able to stay in school and have youth, middle and high school sports, the high school musical, and coming up the spring play. Several of our clubs and student organizations have been active too. A special thank you to our coaches and advisors for taking on the extra responsibility in following the guidelines and all that goes with conducting activities and events during this difficult time.

As I stated back in November, we came back in-person because we believe it is what was best for students' education along with their mental and physical well-being. By following COVID-19 guidelines and cleaning procedures, we are conducting school and activities in a manner that mitigates spread. I can't thank all our District staff enough for everything they have done this year. Staying on top of everything that has been added to an average school day and really making this year as great for our students as we possibly could.

#### **Added Security and Emergency Communication**

To improve police emergency response time and District-wide emergency communication, the School District of Denmark has added 12 police buttons throughout the district. These clearly identified emergency buttons can be found in every school's main office and in visible high traffic areas. This device is an additional tool in our emergency response plan that enables immediate communication and action in an emergency situation.

When pressed, the police buttons send an instant message to police and school officials at every building. The police and designated school District personnel will immediately know where the emergency is. With immediate communication, the police response time is decreased and all buildings can take appropriate actions in following our emergency response plan.

We are the first school district that has worked with Martin Security to add such a device and a direct line of communication to the police throughout our buildings.








### **School District Facility Study Phase 2**

With Phase 1 of the facility study being completed in January 2020 and with having a comprehensive maintenance plan in place, we are now working on Phase 2. Phase 2 includes facility plans, options, and solutions that meet the needs of our educational programming. Our focus areas from the facility study that we are developing and designing solutions for include traffic flow, bus drop-off, and pick-up and the Early Childhood Center.

Below you will see a master planning road map that may lead to a future referendum. As you will see in the road map, we are currently in the option/solution phase with the next steps being a school board workshop and then a community listening session. As solutions and designs are developed, we will share out more information.





GREEN BAY-With technology issues from offsite/virtual learning having been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic, broadband and high speed internet has become a point of emphasis for the country. Now that school districts are shifting back to in-person/hybrid learning models, lessons in broadband connectivity have been taken into account.

With a new FCC high speed internet subsidy aimed at providing low-income households with access to dependable internet speeds, the areas of school, work and telehealth will be greatly impacted in the coming months. As the subsidy will not be available until around May 1<sup>st</sup>, families have an opportunity to change their broadband perspective right now.

Achieve Brown County's Digital Access Team, in collaboration with Brown County and Geo Partners LLC, is currently conducting a countywide speed test. This test is the most statistically significant one of its kind and is designed to highlight the areas of Brown County that are unserved/underserved. With the data collected, the county expects to apply for state and federal grants aimed at improving broadband capabilities.

The test is currently at over 5,600 tests with plans to increase testing in rural areas of the county.

### Denmark School District Preschool Screening Notice Children Age 3 (and turning 3 or 4)

In Accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and the Child Find Law, the School District of Denmark follows a procedure to locate, refer and identify, as early as possible young children who are in need of an Early Intervention Program or Early Childhood Services.

If you live in the School District of Denmark and have a child who is age 3 or turning age 3 or 4 during the current school year, please notify the School District of Denmark Early Childhood Center Office at 920-863-4177.

Once you have contacted the school, you will be placed on a list to receive a questionnaire to complete called the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ). The ASQ is sent in early January of the current school year and helps the district Child Find Team determine if further screening is needed for your child.

### Denmark Middle School CAD to CAM in Tech Ed



We can all agree that the 2020-2021 school year has been a unique school year, but cutting edge CAD (Computer Aided Design) software, CAM (Computer Aided Manufacturing) software, and a CNC Router has allowed our middle school students to do some pretty cool projects in Tech Ed class. Students have been able to grow their 3D CAD skills in a program called SketchUp that runs on their Chromebooks. From SketchUp, students can create their own CAD files to then get imported into the Shop's CNC Router CAM software.

Mr. Belling stresses to the students that while it is nice to use SketchUp to design and customize your project, the true CAD to CAM experience is that it is the students' CAD files that go directly into the CAM software and then on to the CNC router. So in a way, their designs are talking to the CNC machine. Even when we had virtual learning taking place, students were able to send their CAD designs from home to Mr. Belling at school, and their 3D designs were being made in the shop while they were in their next virtual class; and that is pretty cool. This is about as "Real World" as Tech Ed can be for middle school students!


