### PROJECT DETAILS

The proposed facilities plan would close the ECC building and consolidate all students onto one campus. The plan would:

- Reduce traffic congestion around the neighborhood
- Provide a dedicated, secure entrance to better monitor and control visitor access
- Build a dedicated cafeteria and multi-purpose gym for students in grades 4K through 5.
- Provide classrooms and support areas specifically designed for our youngest learners

# Facilities Survey Results Summary

This spring, a facilities survey was sent to all households in the Denmark School District community to gather feedback about funding support for two potential referendum questions for the November 2022 ballot. **Thank You** for taking the survey!

Although the District has been able to significantly update facilities to provide better spaces for our students, staff, and community, needs at the Early Childhood Center (ECC) still need to be addressed through a capital referendum. In addition, the existing operational referendum needs to be renewed. The survey asked for feedback on these two questions, as well as overall satisfaction with the District.

71% Support for \$925,000 Operational Referendum

The operational referendum would likely be supported by 71% of survey respondents.

70% Support for \$29.5M Referendum to Replace the Early Childhood Center

The capital referendum to close the ECC building and consolidate all students onto one campus would likely be supported by 70% of survey respondents.

Tax Impact: BOTH Questions

Capital Referendum: \$29.5M plus Operational Referendum: \$950,000/yr

The plan to replace the ECC and renew the operational referendum would result in an estimated tax mill rate increase of \$0.14 per \$1,000 of property value.

#### Denmark High School Joins Ahnapee Auto and Diesel Maintenance Programs

The 2021-22 school year marked the beginning of Denmark High School's participation in the Ahnapee Auto and Diesel programs. The Ahnapee Auto and Diesel programs are a partnership of area schools including NWTC, Luxemburg-Casco High School (where the program takes place), Kewaunee High School and Denmark High School. Denmark students who participate in the program take required coursework at Denmark High School and then travel to Luxemburg-Casco for auto and diesel maintenance courses taught by NWTC instructors. Students can participate during their junior and senior years and are provided the opportunity to earn college credits while also receiving credit towards high school graduation. Through successful completion of NWTC's Automotive Maintenance Technician (AMT) or Diesel Maintenance Technician (DMT) curriculum, students attain a one-year technical diploma. Following graduation from high school, they may choose to ladder into an associate degree or a two-year technical diploma. These programs are made possible by connections with area companies who contribute equipment and resources to the program and the regional transportation industry.





We **listened** to community feedback when OneDenmark began our quest to assure everyone in Denmark can connect, belong, and thrive. You told us of a vision in which Denmark has a thriving downtown with coffee shops and restaurants, a library, a rehabilitated park and more.

Then OneDenmark **learned** by touring other communities with successful coffee shops, thriving senior centers, co-op grocery stores and other endeavors that used empty buildings (abandoned schools, storefronts & banks) to bring people together in clever ways.

One beautiful example was a storefront turned into a resale shop, run by volunteers, returning all their profits to organizations serving the local community. The shop has donated \$1,000,000 to their community over 15 years.

Now OneDenmark is ready to begin unlocking Denmark's potential by **leading** a movement to promote spaces where the people of Denmark can connect.

OneDenmark's first connecting space provides an intergenerational opportunity.

Inspired Grounds, located in the Village-owned, former bank building, is the brain-child of two Denmark high school students (Isa and Emma). Inspired Grounds is partnering with Denmark Connects, the Village of Denmark, and Denmark High School technology students to institute senior adult and youth connections, via technology training. Funds from OneDenmark and Denmark Connects will be used to open Inspired Grounds and connect these generations. Details coming soon.
