


- 1) Attends school daily and arrives on time, ready to learn

# Denmark School District Covid Information:

The district will no longer be tracking covid cases or mandating testing. We will be reverting back to pre covid health guidelines, where If you are sick, stay home. If a student has a temperature of 100.4 or above they will be sent home.

When a student or staff does receive a positive covid test, they are to get a return to work or school date from their doctor. Guidelines will be modified throughout the year, if needed, and families will be updated.





# Student Illnesses

Students are not to be sent to school if they have a fever (above 100.40 F), diarrhea, vomiting, etc. There is a more comprehensive list below for your reference. In the event students become ill or injured while at school, staff members are to bring students to the office and office personnel will notify parents/guardians or persons designated to act on their behalf to come to school to pick up the ill student.

Keep your child home from school when:

- Fever (above 100.4 F)
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- The illness keeps them from participating comfortably in activities at school
- The illness results in a greater need for care than teachers can provide without affecting their ability to teach the other children in the classroom
- The child appears to be severely ill
- Head lice or nits, until after the first treatment

# 2022-2023 Parent and Bus Drop Off

We are going to have one designated car drop off area and a bus drop off area.

The goal is to make our morning drop off as smooth and safe as possible. Please take time to read the following:

Bus Drop Off 1st - 12 Grade:


All Buses will be entering entrance B and dropping off all 1st - 12th students directly in front of the Elementary School

Elementary and Middle School Parent Drop Off:

All parents dropping off their elementary and middle school students will enter entrance A and drop off in front of the Middle School or Elementary playground. After drop off, all cars will exit B or possibly D if you are dropping off a student at the highschool.

High School Drop Off Only:

Enter entrance C to drop off students in front of the Highschool and exit D.



The red STAR on the map by the bus drop off area indicates a crosswalk. The other crosswalk is located between the Elementary and Middle Schools. For the safety of everyone, please use the crosswalks when walking to the Elementary School.

# 2022-2023 Parent and Bus Pick Up

The route to pick up your child after school is exactly the same as the Drop Off procedure. If you decide to park your vehicle, please do so in the School parking lot. Students and Parents must use the cross-walk. Please do not "wave" your child across to you~ our crossing guards will ensure they cross safely.



# Safety Tips:

#### **SLOW DOWN!**

The speed limit in school zones is 15 MPH. Please remember to SLOW DOWN when approaching our school grounds.

#### **CROSS SAFELY!**

There are two crosswalks to use before and after school for Students and Parents to cross safely. Please only cross at a crosswalk.

We will send out reminders for approaching low balance, low balance and negative balances.



# What are we learning in Guidance in September?

#### Tips and Tricks for Parents

With the start of the school year quickly approaching, we want parents and students to feel prepared and ready to start off on the right foot. From getting a nutritious breakfast to managing back-to-school anxiety, we've got a few quick tips to help kick off the new school year on a positive note.

#### 5 Back-to-School Tips

<u>Allow time for and find a good space for homework.</u> It's important that children have a quiet and consistent work space (a specific spot at the kitchen table or a little nook in a bedroom). In addition, allowing plenty of time to study, complete homework or assignments and prepare for the next day can help them feel ready and successful each day.

<u>Be prepared for the day and eat breakfast.</u> Whether children are provided with a meal at school or home, it's key that they start the day with a healthy and filling breakfast. When children eat a good breakfast, it helps them to stay concentrated and focused throughout the morning and into the rest of the day.

<u>Ensure you are getting enough sleep</u>. If kids don't get enough sleep each night throughout the week, it can be challenging to stay focused on tasks during the day or even throughout class time. Depending on the child's age the optimal amount to sleep can range from eight to 12 hours of sleep a night.

<u>Keep an eye out for Back-to-school anxiety.</u> Returning to school after extended time away can be a source of stress and worry for kids and parents. For many children – especially those with existing mental health and behavioral challenges – adult support and understanding can help. Acknowledging the signs of anxiety and knowing how to provide support can make a great impact for those with these worries.

<u>Stay safe on the way to and from school.</u> Whether you're riding the bus or bike, or going by car or by foot, it's important to keep safety top of mind and be aware of your surroundings. Use safety equipment like seatbelts in the car and on the bus and a helmet while biking. Remember to walk on the sidewalk and stay seated while on the bus.
