Dear Parents/Guardians of the Class of 2021,

Congratulations on your child's upcoming graduation from Denmark High School! The Class of 2021 has had to overcome many challenges in the past eighteen months as they approached this day; challenges that graduating classes have not experienced before them in the past century. Your child and the Class of 2021 have not only overcome these challenges, they've been a constant example of hard work, leadership, and perseverance for our school district and community. You should be very proud of all of their accomplishments! Thank you to you for the countless sacrifices you've made the past eighteen years to support your child and support our school district.

As of the day this letter is being written, the Class of 2021 has thirty days left of their time at Denmark High School. Many things need to be done before commencement and many exciting learning/recognition opportunities are yet to be experienced; however, the following information will help you plan as we prepare for the commencement ceremony of the Class of 2021:

- The commencement ceremony is Sunday, June 6, at 1 PM in the Denmark High School field house.
- Each member of the Class of 2021 will receive 5 tickets to invite attendees. (Five attendees in addition to our graduating class, commencement ceremony staff, our band, and special guests, ensures we meet capacity expectations in relation to the COVID-19 pandemic guidelines.) Tickets will be sent to the primary contact/address listed in Infinite Campus on Friday, May 14. (If a family parent/guardians are not in the same house-hold, the student and parents/guardians will have to distribute tickets accordingly.)
- The commencement ceremony will be broadcast using YouTube for those unable to attend on-site.
- Graduate practices will be ... (Graduation practice is mandatory. Graduation gowns purchased from Jostens will be distributed during the June 2 graduation practice.)

Dear Denmark High School Parents/Guardians:

It is really hard to believe that we are beginning our last month of the 2020-2021 school year. Thank you for all you have done in supporting our school district to ensure this school year has been a successful year for students and staff!

The following is information regarding Prom 2021, which will take place on Saturday, June 5 from 7:00 - 11:00 PM:

- Prom will take place outside, on blacktop, under two large framed tents outside of the high school atrium (near the football field entrance). The area has good lighting, is secure, and provides easy access to the atrium as well as the concession stand. (Both the atrium and concession stand will be open for restrooms and changing areas.) If weather does not cooperate, which will be determined 48-72 hours in advance, prom will be held in the high school atrium. (No other areas of the building will be accessible.)
- In order to acknowledge courts that were not celebrated due to COVID-19 cancellations, Prom 2021 will celebrate the Prom 2020 court, Homecoming 2020 court, and Prom 2021 court.
- Ambrosius Studios will be located in the atrium for pictures.
- Student pickup, at the conclusion of the event, will occur at the student parking lot.
- All "dance" expectations stated in the student handbook will be followed. If a student leaves the area designated for the prom event, he/she will not be allowed to re-enter.
- No individual over the age of twenty will be allowed to attend. Guest passes must be obtained from the high school office, all paperwork completed, and received approval from building administration. (All guests must have a photo ID to be admitted to prom.) The deadline for guest passes is Friday, May 21 at 3:30 PM.
- Tickets will be sold from May 23 June 3. Details related to when and where during the school day will be provided the week leading to sales. An individual ticket is \$10.00. Tickets will be sold to Denmark High School students ONLY at the entrance for \$12.00. A photo ID must be presented for purchase. Ticket sales will pay for either the DJ or tent rental. (The remaining costs of the DJ and tent rental will be covered by the school district.)
- Formal dress is optional; we will not enforce formal attire only. Due to the prom being held outdoors, outside temperatures may vary. Students are encouraged to dress to be comfortable in outside conditions. Jeans

- and t-shirts are not allowed; however, khaki pants/shorts with a polo or button-down shirt are acceptable. Heels are allowed; although, comfortable shoes are encouraged.
- Parents/guardians of Prom 2020, Homecoming 2020, and Prom 2021 court members will be allowed to attend to view the grand march for their child(ren) and participate in the father/daughter - mother/son dance. Once the grand march events are completed, parents/guardians will be expected to leave the event. A detailed schedule will be provided to court parents in early May.
- Masking expectations will be announced the week of the event. Due to changing CDC outdoor guidelines, there may be an opportunity for flexibility assuming nothing changes in the weeks ahead.

Our high school is very excited to put on an event that allows us the opportunity to celebrate this year's junior class as well as representatives of the senior class that were not able to experience prom and homecoming dances and court announcements due to COVID-19 cancellations. Although the event is still a change from "traditional" past years due to current COVID-19 guidelines, I am confident Prom 2021 will be a great evening and a fantastic way to conclude the 2020-2021 school year!

Thank you again for your continued support of Denmark High School. I hope you have an exceptional first weekend of May!



Student Fee Information for the 2020-2021 School Year

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, the Denmark School District chose to delay the collection of school fees for the 2020-2021 school year until the start of the second semester January 25, 2021. School fees are due at this time and open for online payments through the Infinite Campus Parent Portal

www.https://wicloud2.infinitecampus.org/campus/portal/denmark.jsp. With the Coronavirus Pandemic we are encouraging families to make one "household" payment for all student supply fees, course fees, parking fees, etc. with credit card/banking accounts, through the Infinite Campus Parent Portal, in the convenience of your home. (Note: the transaction must be over \$10.00 and there is a \$2.00 processing fee). If you choose not to make payment online, payments should be mailed to 450 N Wall Street, Denmark, WI 54208 or dropped off in any of the school offices at this time.

Due to closing school buildings last March of the 2019-20 school year, some paid events (field trips, camp, etc.) were cancelled causing a surplus balance in the student/s account. Any student surplus from the prior school year was applied to that individual student's 2020-2021 fees and noted in the "Paid" fees. If you would like to apply the remainder of the students surplus to other members in your family please contact the school office to make this payment. After the household balance is 0, if there is surplus left from the 2019-20 school year, it may be left in the account for future fees or call the school office for a refund.

We know that this may be a tough time for our families and our goal is to assist our families in setting up payment plans for those who are unable to make full payment at this time. Please contact your child's school office if you have any questions concerning student fee payments. Note: High school students who have been parking a vehicle in the lot, add the \$20 School Year Parking Permit under Optional Payments to your school fees on Infinite Campus before submitting payment. Paid Parking Permit Tags should be picked up in the school office, all students will be required to have a Parking Permit Tag in their vehicle in order to park in the lot.

Denmark School District Preschool Screening Notice Children Age 3 (and turning 3 or 4)



In Accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and the Child Find Law, Denmark School District follows a procedure to locate, refer and identify, as early as possible young children who are in need of an Early Intervention Program or Early Childhood Services.

If you live in the Denmark School District and have a child who is age 3 or turning age 3 or 4 during the current school year, please notify the Denmark School District's Early Childhood Office at 920-863-4177.

Once you have contacted the school, you will be placed on a list to receive a questionnaire to complete called the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ). The ASQ is sent in early January of the current school year and helps the district Child Find Team determine if further screening is needed for your child.

If you have any immediate concerns about your child's age appropriate development, you can call Sheryl DeLarwelle at 920-863-4035 to inquire about the referral and evaluation process. You can also email her at delarwes@denmark.k12.wi.us.

We currently do not have any In-Person classes scheduled at Denmark High School

Due to covid-19 concerns, we are currently only offering ONLINE Classes.

Classes will be offered at Denmark High School the entire year, including summer.

Counselor's Corner



State Testing (grades 9 & 10 update)

Last month, students in grade 10 completed the Forward Exam and students in grades 9 & 10 took the ACT Aspire. ACT Aspire is a preparatory test for the ACT with Writing, which all students in the state of Wisconsin are required to take in Grade 11. ACT Aspire and Forward provide valuable information for our school. Forward assessed students in Social Studies and ACT Aspire assesses students in the areas of Reading, Writing, English, Math and Science.

<u>ACT</u>

Students in grade 11 took the ACT in March. Students are able to pay to retake the ACT on national test dates if they choose. The next available test date is June 12, 2021. This test is open to all students who register at www.actstudent.org. The deadline to register is May 21st.

Students can access Khan Academy for test prep. It contains free ACT resources and can be accessed through the ACT website at www.act.org - search "free ACT test prep" for links to study guides, practice tests, and webinars.

Scholarships

Early College Credit Program/Start College Now

Denmark offers several different opportunities through which high school students are dually enrolled in both high school and college to earn high school and college credit. These programs can make college more affordable for families and introduce students to higher level coursework before immersing themselves in a rigorous college life.

The 2017-19 State of Wisconsin Biennial Budget included new language regarding high school students who take courses for college credit. The budget combines the Course Options and Youth Options programs into a single new program called the Early College Credit Program (ECCP). High school students at public high schools may be permitted to enroll in a UW System institution, or an alternative private/non-profit institution of higher education to take courses to earn high school credit, post-secondary credit or both. Course costs are shared among the school district/private school and the state (and in some cases, the student's family).

Students in grades 9-12 may be eligible to take courses during the fall, spring, or summer semesters. Please work with your high school counselor to see if you are eligible and begin the application process for the Early College Credit Program. Submit your completed form to your school counselor by February 1st for summer semester, March 1st for fall semester or October 1st for spring semester.

Start College Now will allow 11th and 12th grade students the opportunity to take college courses at Wisconsin Technical Colleges. The application process is very similar to the Early College Credit Program process and the program formerly known as Youth Options. High school students in good academic standing and who have no record of disciplinary problems may have the opportunity to take college courses at their local technical college.

Please work with your high school counselor to see if you are eligible and to begin the application process for Start College Now. **The deadline for applying is March 1st for the fall semester or October 1st for the spring semester.** The school district will then make its determination regarding eligibility and notify you of the decision.

Yearbook Orders

Please go to <u>jostensyearbooks.com</u> to order your yearbook. The cost is \$55. Yearbooks must be ordered by February 26th, 2021. The book will be delivered before school is out this year, so please complete your order soon. Hopefully, we will be able to have a yearbook signing event in the spring.
