DENMARK HIGH SCHOOL MUSIC THEATER RECOGNIZED AT THE 2022 CENTER STAGE HIGH SCHOOL MUSICAL THEATER AWARDS

Throughout the 2021-22 school year, 24 local high schools have participated in the Center Stage High School Musical Theater Program. This year's participating high schools include Ashwaubenon, Brillion, De Pere, Denmark, Fond du Lac, Fox Valley Lutheran, Green Bay East, Green Bay Southwest, Green Bay West, Hortonville, Kaukauna, Little Chute, Luxemburg-Casco, Mishicot, Neenah, New London, Notre Dame de la Baie Academy, Preble, Pulaski, Southern Door, St. Francis Xavier, St. Mary Catholic, Weyauwega-Fremont and Winnebago Lutheran Academy.

Center Stage was launched in 2016 as an education initiative that celebrates and supports the achievements of high school musical theater while developing confidence, creativity and collaboration among high school students throughout Northeast Wisconsin. Education opportunities are provided all season long for students and educators to learn and grow together in their craft. This year, workshops and programs were offered in both virtual and inperson formats, as opportunities allowed.

A team of trained adjudicators attended the participating school's musical production and provided educational feedback. Scores for each production were tabulated and applications were reviewed to determine the program recipients. Participating schools and recognition recipients were celebrated at the Tony Awards style showcase at the Fox Cities Performing Arts Center on May 7, 2022 at 7:30 p.m

For this year's awards, Denmark High School's production of "Cinderella" was nominated for 3 categories:

Outstanding Ensemble (which we received at the ceremony)
Outstanding Performance by a Lead Actor - Henry Pahlow (Prince Topher) Outstanding Performance by a Lead Actress - Sanibel Harper (Marie)

Not only were we nominated for all of these categories, but we were also able to perform a number from our production on the Fox Cities PAC main stage for a sold out crowd. For most of our students this was the first time they have gotten to perform on a stage of that magnitude, and to say that it was incredibly exciting would be an understatement.

To be chosen out of all of these participating schools for these categories was an honor and is something that was very new and exciting for the DHS Music Theater program. Using the momentum from this past school year's production we hope to continue to build a standard of excellence for our theater program and hopefully continue to excel year to year with our performances.





moving on to the National competition.




Lashawna Vogel completed her year of service as the Wisconsin FFA State Reporter. We are proud of all her accomplishments during her FFA career!




