Dear Parents/Guardians,

It's hard to believe we're already talking about next year's musical, but with auditions quickly approaching, the production team would like to offer you a heads up about some of the plans we have in store.

First, auditions for the musical will be May 16th and 17th after school. Select roles may have callbacks on May 19th. The cast will be posted on the Friday of that week, May 20th, and if we offer your child a role or they are interested in pit/crew, we'll have a parent meeting after the show read through on Monday, May 23rd at 6:00 p.m. to discuss the details of next year's musical plans.

Although we'll go into further detail on these things at the parent meeting, we want to also give you an idea of some plans for the summer months. We'll be having get togethers each month leading up to the beginning of the school year. We believe these are crucial not only to accomplish certain things related to musical preparation, but also to help the kids bond. It's incredibly important that these kids form a team mentality prior to regular rehearsals so they are working hard toward a common goal. These days will be open not only to actors, but to crew and pit students as well.

We'll be building the set in July and will need a tremendous amount of help putting it together. Therefore, we'll have sign ups for students, parents, friends, and anyone else that would be willing to lend a hand in reaching that goal. It's far easier to accomplish things during rehearsals when the actors have a set to work with right away! Each year we typically see the same handful of people at these set builds and it's our goal this year to have everyone offer at least a little time toward the construction. You don't need to be experienced in the area—just being willing to carry things, paint, or hold set pieces in place as others work on them can be an incredible help!

Finally, we'll be holding vocal lessons and choreography sessions in August. Although we understand that there are often vacations planned during this month, it's very important for your child to do their best to be at these scheduled rehearsals if they're cast in the show—regardless of their role. Unlike with sports, the musical students are presented with new material/different things they must learn for the performance at every rehearsal right up until October. They are learning songs, dance moves, and stage movement and if they are absent, it takes a lot of time helping them catch up. Likewise, fellow cast members count on each other being present so they can get used to the consistency of what's happening on stage. We're hoping this notice will help you and your student plan accordingly. We'll try to have specific dates as soon as possible.

We are so excited for the musical this year and we hope to see your child at the auditions! Thank you for your continued support of our program!

DIAL “1” for the Attendance Line

Please help get the information to the right place. Dial 1 for attendance in all buildings and leave a detailed message on the attendance line. This message should include:

1. Your child’s name, reason for the absence, date and time of the absence, parent name and phone number you where you can be reached if there would be any questions. Please be assured that these messages are checked continually during the day.



Your child’s success in school is a goal we share. We work hard to partner with our families to make sure all students are at school, on time for school, and throughout the school day, every day! **Per Wisconsin state statute a parent/guardian can excuse their student for not more than ten days per school year.** We understand that

extenuating circumstances do happen in families and we are committed to working with you. Your school welcomes the opportunity to discuss any questions or concerns you may have regarding your child's attendance. By figuring out the reasons for your child's absences—whether they're physical or emotional—and taking advantage of support services—such as school counseling, nursing and social work services—you can help set your child on the path to success! Families can expect strong support from school personnel as you establish family practices that promote school attendance.

Here are a few actions you can make to help promote compulsory school attendance:

- Call your student's school each day they will not be in attendance and state the reason for the absence
- Obtain medical excuses when your student attends appointments so their absences can be excused and not count towards the 10-day limit
- Contact your school social worker or school resource officer if you have concerns about your student's absences or your student is refusing to come to school. We can work together to ensure barriers are eliminated to support attendance.
- Review your student's absences via Infinite Campus to keep track of absences

Please note by law, the school district of Denmark is required to begin the habitual truancy process once a student is considered habitually truant.



To locate the preapproved absence form, please go to the Denmark High School website. Under the families tab you will find forms. The pre-approved absence form is located there. Please print the form and complete it. You can bring this form to the office, fax this form (920-863-8856), or email it to kittells@denmark.k12.wi.us.



MEDICATION REQUIREMENTS

All medication must be dispensed from the school office. Students are not allowed to carry medication on their person, for their safety as well as the safety of other students. An exception to this rule is students who must carry emergency inhalers. Students requiring emergency inhalers are allowed to carry them ON THEIR PERSON. However, the physician **MUST** indicate this on the Physician Request Form. Parents/Guardians **MUST NOTIFY** Mrs. Amber Kapinos, RN, School Nurse, if a student will be carrying an emergency inhaler. Mrs. Kapinos can be contacted by calling 863-4032.

Message From Food Service,

We are experiencing food shortages just like the rest of the country, please be patient with us as we navigate through this. I will try my best to communicate through the District communication process.

Great news! All enrolled students of the School District of Denmark are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school for FREE each day of the 2021-22 school year or until funding is exhausted. Your child(ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit a meal application. This is possible through the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) of the National School Lunch and Breakfast Programs. Milk Break is a separate program and is based on free, reduced and paid status. **Milk cost is \$.45 per carton. Milk with Lunch and Breakfast is part of the meal. Extra milk or milk with lunch from home is \$.45.**

School meal participation goes beyond helping students with their nutrition. Our food and nutrition program provides real funding beyond the cafeteria into the classrooms.

We still encourage families to fill out meal applications! When we receive free and reduced meal applications we are eligible for more federal funds. The free and reduced eligibility that is initially used for free or reduced meal participation is also used to determine our district's eligibility for other funding such as Title 1, E-rate, and funds other programs across the district.

In the event funding becomes exhausted in SY 21-22 meal rates are as follows:

Breakfast All Schools: \$1.70, Reduced \$.30 Adults \$2.15

Elementary/ECC Lunch \$2.60, Reduced \$.40

Middle School/ High School \$3.00, Reduced \$.40 ** Premium Meal \$3.50, Adult \$4.15

Early College Credit Program/Start College Now

Denmark High School offers several different dual enrollment opportunities for students to earn high school and college credit. These programs can make college more affordable for families and introduce students to higher level coursework.

The Early College Credit Program (ECCP) allows high school students at public high schools to enroll in a UW System institution, or an alternative private/non-profit institution of higher education to take courses to earn high school credit, post-secondary credit or both. Course costs are shared among the school district, state (and in some cases, the student's family).

Students in grades 9-12 may be eligible to take courses during the fall, spring, or summer semesters. Please work with your high school counselor to see if you are eligible and begin the application process for the Early College Credit Program. **Submit your completed form to your school counselor by February 1st for summer semester, March 1st for fall semester or October 1st for spring semester.**

Start College Now (SCN) allows high school students the opportunity to take college courses at Wisconsin Technical Colleges. The application process is very similar to the Early College Credit Program. High school students in good academic standing and who have no record of disciplinary problems may have the opportunity to take college courses at their local technical college.

Please work with your high school counselor to see if you are eligible and to begin the application process for Start College Now. **The deadline for applying is March 1st for the fall semester or October 1st for the spring semester.** The school district will then make its determination regarding eligibility and notify you of the decision.

Comprehensive Sports Physicals

Each participant will go through various stations and receive the following:

- Health screening by a physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner
- Musculoskeletal and functional movement screening using video analysis software to review form and offer options on how to improve imbalances.
