What is the National Junior Honors Society?

The National Junior Honor Society is the leader among educational organizations and societies that promotes recognition for middle level students who reflect outstanding accomplishments in the areas of scholarship, leadership, service, citizenship, and character.

Requirements for Application

Part 1: Scholarship

Requirement: Achieve a cumulative 3.5 grade point average. This average must be maintained to remain in membership.

Part 2: Service

Requirement: 20 hours of service is required with an emphasis on school service. A minimum of 5 hours must be completed by application date. These hours may include but are not limited to, service committees, clubs, church work, volunteer work, etc. and can be done as a group or individually.

**Hours of service from June 1, 2021 through the present may be used for application.

Part 3: Citizenship Essay

Requirement: A typed or written essay, 200-250 words, answering a question supplied by the application committee.

Part 4: Character Reference

Requirement: An evaluation must be completed by **one of each** of the following (two total):

- A Denmark teacher or staff member who has worked with the candidate in the classroom
- An adult community member (not immediate family) who has supervised the candidate in a role
 of responsibility

Message from Food Service

Great news! All enrolled students of the School District of Denmark are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school for FREE each day of the 2021-22 school year or until funding is exhausted. Your child (ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit a meal application. This is possible through the Seamless Summer Option (SSO) of the National School Lunch and Breakfast Programs. Milk Break is a separate program and is based on free, reduced and paid status. Milk cost is \$.45 per carton. Milk with Lunch and Breakfast is part of the meal. Extra milk or milk with lunch from home is \$.45.



School meal participation goes beyond helping students with their nutrition. Our food and nutrition program provides real funding beyond the cafeteria into the classrooms.

We still encourage families to fill out meal applications! When we receive free and reduced meal applications we are eligible for more federal funds. The free and reduced eligibility that is initially used for free or reduced meal participation is also used to determine our district's eligibility for other funding such as Title 1, E-rate, and funds other programs across the district.

In the event funding becomes exhausted in school year 21-22 meal rates are as follows:

Breakfast All Schools: \$1.70, Reduced \$.30 Adults \$2.15 Elementary/ECC Lunch \$2.60, Reduced \$.40 Middle School/ High School \$3.00, Reduced \$.40 ** Premium Meal \$3.50, Adult \$4.15

** Free/Reduced Meal Applications are accepted July 1st 2021 thru June 2022

Parent Communication: New Payment Processing Vendor Dear Parents, On March 8, 2021, Infinite Campus announced it is switching payment processors for all online payment functions in the Campus Portal. This summer we have chosen to make the switch for the 2021-22 school year. This will have minimal impact on you. However, any payment methods you've set up for your credit cards or eCheck accounts will be deleted to ensure the security and confidentiality of your data. After we make the switch, you will be asked to enter your payment methods into the Parent Portal. Any Recurring Payments you may have set up (if you intend to continue making payments this way), will also need to be updated to use the new payment methods you create. There are no other changes in the way you will experience online payments. This change will improve financial reporting efficiency for the district, as well as the support experienced by district staff when researching reported issues.
