We are so excited to flip the calendar to March! Longer days, more sunshine, hopefully some warmth, just what we need.










## Middle School FFA

# Ineative Ant Corner

7th Grade Year Long students completed Passion Projects- This is a project-based learning activity in which students research any topic they are passionate about and create a project they share with the class or school. This encourages creativity in the classroom as well as promotes inquiry, perseverance, problem solving, and innovation.









## Need for Speed!



Students in Mr. Belling's 8th Grade Yearlong Technology and Engineering class recently completed their CO2 Race Car Project. The students are introduced to many different skills for this project. They used a 3D Engineering program called Autodesk Inventor to design their cars ahead of time. Then using a printout, they were able to build their cars in the shop using a variety of tools and machines.

Upon completion of their cars, students raced them against each other using CO2 cartridges to launch them toward the finish line down the hallway. The goal was the same for all students; design the fastest CO2 Car. All students were given the same starting wood block, the same axles, and the same wheels. The difference between their race cars was the shape of the body of the car.

Students approached this project as a "real world" challenge and engaged in researching, brainstorming,

engineering, fabricating, and reflecting phases in their project documentation. In the end, there can only be one "fastest" car. With a 3D Printed Denmark Trophy on the line for the winner, the students did a great job cheering each other on and learning from each race.

Every year, the students get so into this project because they think the coolest part is racing the car and every year, Mr. Belling tells them the coolest thing about this project is how much they grow as Tech Ed students practicing all of these awesome skills!
